

Differences Between the 1995 & 2005 TBRPC Strategic Regional Policy Plan

- Revisions are intended to address the findings of the adopted December 2001 SRPP EAR and implement the recommendations of the January 2003 Regional Visioning Assembly. This is accomplished by improving readability and usability, eliminating redundancy, and collapsing/merging many policies under a single goal or theme area.
- Sections associated with the requirements of Rule 27E-5, F.A.C., were collapsed and incorporated into a Foreword section or appendices, as appropriate.

- Regionally Significant Resources and Facilities

Regionally significant resources and facilities are no longer identified at the conclusion of a required goal area but rather are combined into a single chapter. List greatly expanded to be more comprehensive and reflective of the revised goals and policies. To the maximum extent possible, maps of regionally significant resources and facilities were developed and incorporated into document.
